Funding for learning in adult social care

The Adult Social Care Training and Development Fund From 1 April 2024 the training and development fund starts to replace the Workfroce Development Fund for adult social care. The Department of Health and Social Care has published an employers guide for the new fund. The two key areas are:

- **care skills funding**, including for the newly developed Level 2 Adult Social Care Certificate. You can find the list of funded programmes and qualifications **here**
- revalidation funding to support continuous professional development (CPD) for eligible registered staff

In order to claim care skills funding employers (including local authorities) must

- provide an adult social care service
- directly employ care staff in England and

Residual Workforce Development Fund Any eligible qualifications started before 31 March 2024 and completing by 31 March 2025 will be eligible for Workforce Development Funding, as long as the employer completed the required registered Adult Social Care Workforce Data Set (ASC-WDS) account user and submitted your declaration form by 29 February 2024 This should be claimed directly from Skills for Care Find more details here
